Zion Lutheran Church, Wausau, WI is no longer part of the ELCA. Rev. Steven Gjerde and Rev. Chris Johnson joined the Roster of Ministers of Lutheran Congregations in Mission in Christ (LCMC). The LCMC began in 2001 in response to some liberal views of the ELCA. The LCMC permits, but does not require, the ordination of female clergy. LCMC does not bless same sex partnerships.
