God gives each one of you a spiritual gift. Spiritual gifts are essential for the ministry of God. Is there a spiritual gift that has more value or status than another? The apostle Paul writes to Christians in Corinth, in south-central Greece, who competed with one another as to whose spiritual gift was more important than the other. To end the competition, the apostle Paul introduces the messianic politics of the body.* According to Greco-Roman culture, superior knowledge and classism defined a person. Orators in antiquity treated eloquent speech as the expression of wisdom and superiority. Paul recognizes the debilitating influence of this

thinking on the Church. In his letter, Paul challenges their wisdom by teaching that the true wisdom comes through the weakness and vulnerability of a crucified Messiah.

Paul uses the political language of the body to explain the unity and diversity of the body of Christ. In contrast with Paul's teaching, "Greco-Roman authors and orators appealed to the political significance of the body in order to emphasis the predominance of the head so as to re-inscribe the hierarchical order of imperial society."* In 1 Corinthians 12:14, Paul states that "the body does not consist of one member but of many." Paul's statement criticizes Caesar, who is considered the head of the Roman empire and controls all his subjects. Paul is protesting the hegemonic body politics of Rome that coerces the weaker of society to serve the stronger. He teaches that the body of the crucified Christ tore down classism and superiority and started an egalitarian body.

God gives each member of the body a special gift for the well-being of the whole body (1 Corinthians 12:7), not for competition. What is interesting is the alternative translation of the term "community or body" in Latin. "The munus of the Latin word communus means 'duty' or 'obligation' as well as 'gift'," which signifies "that members of a community are bound by a "gift" that is to be given or shared rather than received."

Paul teaches that the spiritual gifts are intended to be used for the benefit of all the members of the body of Christ and should not lead to competition. Any individual with any gift whether spiritual or non-spiritual is called to renounce one's self-interest for the sake of the body of Christ. Paul is calling the Corinthians and us to use our gifts in the service of all members of the church. To be part of the body of Christ means to sacrifice on the altar your individual self-preservation.**

The division and hierarchy in the church of Corinth are found in many churches today. Many church leaders are striving for a leadership role for their own interest. The only interest in having a leadership role is to serve Jesus Christ, not oneself. To be a leader means to serve with a spirit of humility. Any church or organization will fail if its leaders use their position and gifts for their own interest or they do not take their gifts and leadership roles seriously. Many parishioners leave the church because the leaders of the church concentrate on their own prestige and egos. It is dangerous for the mission of a church if its leaders are self-centered and unwilling to delegate tasks. As you are serving the Lord Jesus Christ in his church, I invite you to focus on serving Jesus Christ without self-centeredness or self-interest. Serve Christ from a heart of love for your neighbors. Your gifts are special blessings you receive from God for the good of your neighbor. Sharing, not holding onto your gifts, helps in advancing the kingdom of God.

What kind of gifts have you received from God that you can share to build the body of Christ? Reflect on your gifts. Ask God to reveal to you your spiritual gift. You are welcome to discuss with me your gift. May the Lord Jesus Christ help you to discern your gifts.

Hamilton Lot Loan Report:

The loan refinance documents were signed on 12/31/2018 with Intercity State Bank. The new loan was for \$15,548.64 at 5.25% interest (the best of 4 lenders, including BMO Harris where loan previously was). \$125.24 will be automatically drafted on the last day of each month. We did pay down \$9,000 from the proceeds of the Adams Street Lot Sale. Also, \$5000. was applied from the Max Anderson Memorial donation. In January, we are using available parking lot remaining Funds to make an additional principal payment of \$895. Council decided, each month any amount in our Hamilton parking lot Fund above \$400. will be used to pay principal. There is no prepayment penalty and it is our intention to have this loan paid in full within 3 years. Please continue to make separate donations to the Parking Lot Fund, as it is a benefit to us
