From the Pastor's Desk

"To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps" (1 Peter 2:21).

"It is okay" is a phrase that has bothered me because we often misuse it. To say to someone "it is okay," you mean do not worry about it or it is not a problem... etc. I have noticed that people express their condolences to a grieving person by saying "it is okay." By saying this statement to a person in crisis, you make that person feel like one's suffering is not a big deal. It also indicates that you do not care. It becomes socially acceptable to say the phrase "it is okay," even though your life is treating you unjustly. I recall one of my visits to one of the hospitals in Wausau, where one of my parishioners was in deep pain. A nurse responded to his suffering by saying "it is okay." I was surprised by her response. I looked at her and said, "it is not okay."

Why are we afraid to admit our pain and suffering? Why does it become socially acceptable to hide our emotional, mental, physical, and spiritual distress? There are many reasons that we may disguise our emotional pain, but in doing so, we deepen our pain.

Suffering may be our daily reality and is a part of living in a broken world. It is not okay to put a mask on our face to hide our pain. Jesus incarnated to be part of our suffering. He did not say to our suffering "it is okay." Because our suffering was important to him, Jesus willingly entered our suffering and made it his burden. He carried our pain to redeem us. On the cross, Jesus did not say "it is okay," but "it is fulfilled." Jesus' grace enters our sufferings to help us see him working in our struggles. Jesus can sympathize with our pain. He indeed suffered. That is why he understands our suffering.

Jesus encourages us to carry each other's burden, not to overlook one another's suffering. As we are starting a New Year, let us reflect on how to bear each other's burden and help each other to deepen our faith. I encourage you to express your pain verbally. Please, do not hesitate to talk to me about your challenges. I am always willing to listen and to support you.

2. Call the meeting to order by Bob Henning at 6:45pm

3. Church officer reports:

a. Secretary

i. September Minutes were presented, and Motion made to Accept Minutes by Judi M., 2nd by Patti, Motion approved.

ii. October Minutes were presented, and Motion made to accept Minutes by Judi M., 2nd by Judy K.

b. Treasurer; Matt reviewed Budget Expense report. Payment for Organ Fund was moved to new Organ Fund. Copier wasn't printing so report wasn't complete but he shared Income vs Expenses balance was \$6,908. He also presented the Current Position and Designated Funds report. Motion made by Marge, 2nd by Judi M., to accept October reports for audit.

c. Financial Secretary: Patti reviewed October report. Motion was made by Judi M to accept the October report and hold for audit, 2nd by Jamie. Motion passed.

d. Vice President: Jamie suggested Matt should do Bookkeeping duties in a clearly defined, paid position. Jamie made a Motion to pursue having Matt take on bookkeeping duties in a paid position. 2nd by Judy K, Motion passed with abstained vote from Matt. e. Worship; Judy K reported over \$13,000. in Organ Fund. There will be a "Blue Service" around Christmas time, everyone is welcome and especially those who have deaths of family or friends in the past year. She also noted the Endowment Committee has Funds in escrow for Organ repair, if needed.
