From the Pastor's Desk

Jesus answered "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4).

When you think of persecution of Christians, what comes to mind? You might think of non-Christians opposing Christians. When we think of Satan attacking our church, we usually think of outside evil forces. What if the evil power emerges from within the church? Yes, the forces of evil work to destroy Christians' faith from within the church. I will highlight two focal points that illustrate the work of Satan against the church on both moral and faith levels.

On the moral level, sexual abuse of children and adults by clergy in the Catholic and Southern Baptist churches have left deep wounds in the relationship between Christians and clergy. Destroying documents about clergy sexual abuse and ignoring the suffering of the victims are the work of the forces of evil

inside the church. By the way, we Lutherans do have sexual abuse in our churches, but on a small scale. Spiritual and physical abuse could create barriers between Christians and their church and eventually a barrier between believers and their Lord Jesus Christ.

On the faith and theological levels, the forces of evil attack the faith of the church. The significant example is the so-called "Christ Myth Theory" that denies the existence of Jesus. In the 19th century, German liberal evangelical theologian, David Friedrich Strauss was the first one to propose this theory. Many Christian scholars and clergy have adopted and developed his theory. Some of them often have taken a polemical stand toward Christianity. They promote the notion that there was never an historical Jesus, only a mythological character or "religious conception." Their teaching attracts a large audience because they use a multitude of publications and websites.

It is sad, but not surprising, to find that this heresy emerged from the church. It is evident that the forces of evil are attacking the church from within. Satan aims to destroy the church from within. He does not need to bring non-Christians to destroy it. Christians can do the work. The apostle Paul teaches "For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places" (Ephesians 6:12).

I encourage you as we begin our Lenten journey, walking in the wilderness with Jesus Christ, to constantly pray for the protection of the church from all heresy and immoral behavior. Ask Jesus to send his Holy Spirit to help us transform evil into good. Ask the Holy Trinity to help us resist all evil power that denies Christ, defies God and draws us from Jesus Christ.

Jesus gives us a good example of how to fight the devil. Jesus defeated him through prayer, fasting, and meditating on the word of God. Let us follow Jesus' example. Have a blessed Lent.


Lenten Bible Study: We are going to study the Passion of Jesus Christ and cover the following topics:

This is the cause of the Koinonia and the room above being very warm, repair lighting in fellowship hall. Repair

lighting replacement tubes and ballasts in fish sandwich, repair motor bracket on boiler circulation pump. (Thank you, Al Spoehr for doing the welding), repair Secretary's computer, change and document door code change procedure, research disposal of fluorescent tubes (Hazardous materials, 50 cents a tube at Ringle Landfill), research LED replacements for Fluorescent tubes: 48" type-b, 120V, non-ballast, single end bypass. \$4.25 ea, or \$3.99 ea in 25 pack Art Dellenbach quoted \$9 ea., with \$2 rebate. Finished repair on the urinal flush valve.

A Date for Your Calendar. Please reserve Monday, April 1st on your calendar- no fooling! On that day Immanuel will be privileged to host a Pilgrimage to Peace panel presentation by the Churches for Middle East Peace (CMEP).

Wausau is one of three sites on their national spring tour. The four panel members will be in the Wausau area April 1-3 and will be presenting to a variety of audiences. During the presentations, they will discuss realities affecting the Palestinian refugee community and the importance of advocating for human rights in Israel, the Palestinian Territories and with refugees throughout the Middle East. The occupation of the Palestinian territories impacts people living on all sides of the conflict, including both Israelis and Palestinians. The panel features Suzann Mollner, Executive Director of Beirut and Beyond, a Palestinian refugee support organization, and Obada Shtaya, formerly of One Voice Movement, now with Zimam, empowering young Palestinian leaders. CMEP Outreach Director, Sara Burback and Development Director, Alison Glick complete the panel.
