From the Pastor's Desk

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

When I became the pastor at our church, several people told me that they had never heard of a Palestinian Lutheran. They never knew that the Lutheran Church exists in Palestine. I assume not many of you know that the Lutheran Church exists in Russia. When we talk about Christianity in Russia, we immediately think of the Eastern Orthodox Church. I read an article in the Living Lutheran issue of January, 2020 titled *Fighting the Odds: How the Lutheran Church in Russia Continues to Evolve.* I found the article very interesting and it provided important information. I am going to offer you more information about the Lutheran Church in Russia. Let us explore the story of faith and resilience.

In the middle of the 16th century, the Tsar, Ivan The Terrible, was the first Tsar to invite Germans to Russia to modernize the Russian army. Many of those Germans were Lutherans. They settled in Moscow. Later in the 17th to 19th centuries, more Lutherans settled in Russia, Ukraine and the Caucuses, Central Asia, and Siberia, with two-thirds of all settlers being Lutheran. The reason behind increasing the population of Lutherans was due to the marriage of Tsars with Lutheran princesses. This led to establishing the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ingria in Russia by a few parishes of Finnish and Sweden immigrants. In 1703, Peter the Great gave permission to the Lutheran church to open a new parish in St. Petersburg, which is St. Mary's Cathedral Church of Ingria to this day.

Lutherans were not allowed to worship in the Russian language and their membership was restricted to non-Russian nationalities. "Until the 1905 Edict of Toleration, Lutherans were not permitted to perform the liturgy in the Russian language." After the Communist revolution in 1917 that resulted in persecuting the church and executing almost 90% of the pastors and priests, the Lutheran church and seminary ceased to exist. The war between the Soviet Union and the Nazis made the Lutherans' life in the Soviet Union intolerable. Stalin ordered the deportation of approximately 1 million Germans to Kazakhstan and Siberia.

In 1956 the first Evangelical Lutheran congregation was registered in Astana, Kazakhstan. In 1964 Soviet Germans were allowed to go back to their original places of residence, and by 1980, 80 Lutheran churches had reopened.

The first postwar German churches that appeared were Lutheran Brethren communities. Despite persecution, they remained faithful to the faith. They held prayer meetings up to five times a week. Because they did not have pastors, lay leaders were allowed to read printed sermons. To this day,

Lutheran Brethren communities refuse to integrate into any Lutheran body in Russia.

Today there are two major Lutheran churches in Russia. The progressive one is represented by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Russia, Ukraine, Kazakhstan and Central Asia (ELKRAS) and the conservative one is represented by the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ingria in Russia (ELCIR). The difference between the two church bodies is like the difference between the ELCA and the Missouri Synod. ELCIR has two seminaries: one in St. Petersburg and a new one in the city of Krasnoyarsk. ELKRAS is growing in Central Asia (up to 30%) and has around 600 parishes with a particular presence in Kaliningrad and St. Petersburg and one seminary in Novosaratovka. "ELKRAS and ELCIR produce Finnish and Russian bilingual magazines..., And a joint news bulletin... Both churches have been members of the Lutheran World Federation."

Besides ELKRAS and ELCIR, several other Lutheran denominations and missions are present in Russia. They have their own seminaries which were mostly established by Finnish and Swedish missionaries.

The ELCA has a strong relationship with ELKRAS and ELCIRN. The Northwest Washington Synod, Northeastern Minnesota Synod and Central States Synod are establishing companion relationships with ELKRAS and ELCIRN. The ELCA has a presence in Russia through the Global Mission. Rev. Bradn Buerkle, an ELCA missionary, lives in St. Petersburg, teaches seminars and provides distance learning for pastors and lay leaders across the vast territory of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Russia.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Status of Women at Immanuel. By at least 1923, women had the right to vote and hold office at Immanuel. This was highly unusual in the Norwegian Lutheran male centered tradition, a circumstance that was engrained in other Christian congregations as well. Bertha Pearson was elected secretary in 1923 and held that position for many years. She was an influential leader both in the congregation and in the community.

Most leadership positions, however, still were held by men through the first century of our history until Vonnie Henning, the late wife of our current president, Bob Henning, became the first female president in 1984. Many women have held that office since. Under the old constitution the pastor named members to the board of deacons, an esteemed position in the church polity. Thelma Bursik was the first female to be named a deacon in 1971. Confirmation age boys were used as acolytes until girls also began to light the altar candles in the late 1960s. In that decade also the practice began of using laymen to read the lessons of the day during worship services. Soon women assumed that duty as well. A few years ago Immanuel had an all-female church council guided by a female pastor, the only congregation in the area (and possibly the synod and beyond) to hold that distinction. What an amazing change from Immanuel's earlier history. -- Al Solomonson

3. Pastor's report

- a. There is an ELCA grant of \$10,000 available to feed the hungry. Linda will contact the school district and/or The Neighbors Place to see who would be the most willing to partner with ILC to apply for this grant.
- b. Pastor Niveen has contacted First English, St. Stephen and St. Andrew churches and found out that none of them have a written policy regarding same sex employees, members or marriage. Pastor Niveen will contact the ELCA to get recommendations and guidelines in helping ILC establish our own same sex policies.
