From the Pastor's Desk

For everything, there is a season,
A time for every activity under heaven.
A time to be born and a time to die.
A time to plant and a time to harvest.
A time to kill and a time to heal (Ecclesiastes 3)

Change is surrounding us from everywhere. Our lives are full of seasons of change. Changes in trees' color, change in our lifestyle because of coronavirus, change in work and health, and the recent change of our ECSW Bishop. In my personal life, losing my father to cancer brought a significant change in my family life. A change could be sweet, but it could be bitter, too. No one likes a great change in their lives, particularly if the change comes with significant challenges. When change comes and interferes with our plans, we feel vulnerable and confused.

We have experienced a change in our ministry because of coronavirus. Some are uncomfortable with the changes, and others have been working to adapt. God does not allow changes to enter our lives to break us. The painful changes aim to mature us in faith and our relationships with one another. Despite great grief, the change that God brought to my life after the death of my father has strengthened my relationship with my family and united us more than ever.

Typically, when we encounter difficult challenges in our lives, we intend to find a new plan for our lives and begin to figure out how to move forward. When I learned about my father's death and watched his funeral, the first question that came to my mind is how I will live my life without him. I have not found an answer yet, but I fully trust in Jesus' promise, "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). I might not know the way to heal my grieving heart, but I trust in the person who said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). Regardless of what season of change you are experiencing in your life, trust in God's promises to be with you always no matter what. Seasons bring changes, but God's love for you will never change. God's love is new every day.

I am grateful for each one of you who is supporting me in this difficult time. I also thank you for your cards and gifts.

The Rev. Anne Edison-Albright Elected Bishop of the East Central Synod of Wisconsin



On September 26th the East Central Synod of Wisconsin gathered virtually for the 2020 Synod Assembly. The Rev. Anne Edison-Albright was elected Bishop of the synod on the 5th ballot with a total of 151 votes. The entirety of the synod assembly proceeding along with the complete results of the election for Bishop can be found on the synods website at www.ecsw.org

Bishop-Elect Anne Edison-Albright currently serves as the Director of College Ministries and College Pastor at Luther College in Decorah, IA. She has served the Luther College community since 2016. She previously served as pastor at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Stevens Point, WI, her first call, from 2010-2016. Her pastoral ministry in both Wisconsin and Iowa have been marked by passion for ecumenical and interfaith collaboration; community organizing; faith formation for all ages; collegiality and joy in bringing congregations together; and encouraging

and equipping lay and rostered leaders. The Rev. Edison-Albright has also served as a hospital chaplain, a pastoral intern at the international congregation in Bratislava, Slovakia, and a summer missionary/English teacher in Chu Zhou, China. Before becoming a pastor, Anne was a high school English and English as a Second Language teacher in Houston, TX.

Anne received Bachelor of Arts degrees in English and journalism from Michigan State University in East Lansing, MI (2003) and an MDiv from Yale Divinity School in New Haven, CT (2008). She's married to Sean Edison-Albright and is mom to Walter and Sally. She enjoys gardening, baking, embroidery and listening to podcasts to refresh and renew her. Following her election as bishop she stated,

“Coming back to the East Central Synod of Wisconsin feels like coming home, and I am looking forward to reconnecting and also getting to know the synod in a very new way. I am honored and grateful for the opportunity to serve alongside you as bishop; to encourage and equip you as leaders and to be part of the good and vital work you are doing every day. I am deeply thankful for the ministry and leadership of Bishop Mansholt, and pray for transition blessings for him and Anita and the whole family. I ask for prayers for me, Sean, Walter and Sally, too!”

From: V.P. Linda Hulstrom:

To our caring ILC Congregation:

I believe most of you are aware of Pastor Niveen's father's passing and would like to help their family, as I do.

I communicated with Bishop Mansholt and he instructed me that the best way to help is to send our collective collections to his office to be sent to Augusta Victoria Hospital (AVH) in Jerusalem, and his office will send it to them. The Augusta Victoria Hospital (AVH) is a program of the Lutheran World Federated Department for World Service in Jerusalem. Since Pastor's family couldn't afford his treatments, Bishop Mansholt intervened on their behalf, and so the Hospital paid for his entire care there. The best way we can help is to help the Hospital so they can continue to help others in dire need of care.

I plan to send our funds to the Bishops office on October 19, 2020. Please drop off cash or check made out to ILC (memo line AVH), and we will send one check to the Bishop's office. Pastor Niveen appreciates that some of us want to help her family directly, but she is maintaining their needs for now.

When you write to Dear Friend in Christ, your letter will be swapped with a letter from another writer. They will get your letter; you will get their letter. The exchange is anonymous (unless you provide your contact information), so you can share as little or as much information about yourself as you like.

Fellowship not only makes the journey enjoyable; it also helps keep us healthy.

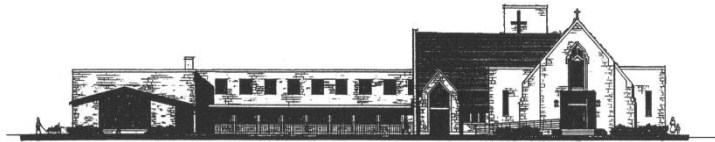

IMMANUEL HISTORY –



Immanuel's Chancel and The Cross

On December 18, 1949, the congregation of Immanuel Lutheran dedicated a new church building – just in time for the observance of Christmas. It was considered the most important event in the congregation's 66-year history. The architect considered the building to be “modern and functional, producing a result that is pleasing and ecclesiastical in spirit and yet practical.” The seating capacity in the nave was 300 with additional seating in the balcony and in a room on the left side of the chancel with multiple panel doors that could be opened to the altar. (Now a small storage room and a nursery.) This room would also function as a conference room and a practice area for the choir.

As one is seated in the nave, attention is drawn to the chancel arch, designed to be the dominant theme of the altar area. The altar is designed to be of “simple and chaste” design. A major feature is the suspended cross above the altar symbolizing the day of redemption. It is a suspended cross, an empty cross to show that the cross could not hold our Lord but that He is our living Lord. Because of the distinct and intentional outline of the chancel with the cross positioned above the altar, the eyes of the worshipers tend always to be focused on that suspended cross. It is a distinct feature of our worship area. In the 1980s and 1990s some members thought there should be an American flag placed in the chancel. It was discussed in two congregational meetings, and each time the proposal was voted down by a large majority. It seems that the congregation understands that the unique placement of the cross above the altar emphasizes the centrality of the cross in Christian theology, and other symbols should not detract from the architect's “simple and chaste” design.

Immanuel Lutheran Church Council Meeting – Thursday, August 27, 2020 (Meeting via Zoom)

Members present: Pastor Niveen Sarras, President Bob Henning, Vice-President Linda Hulstrom, Treasurer Matt Munson, Financial Secretary Patti Busche, Evangelism Janci Treutel, Stewardship Rick Lohr

Members absent: Worship Judy Kort, education Judy Nickolai.

1. Devotions were led by Pastor Niveen based on Matthew 16: 13-20. Peter was certain of Jesus identity as the Messiah & Son of the Living God. Jesus is the Rock on which the church is built. Jesus is building the church – we are only messengers. We need to depend on Christ and not on our own strength. Don't be discouraged as Christ promised to build the church.
2. The meeting was called to order at 6:20 by Bob Henning.
3. Pastor's report
4. On 8/20 there was a discussion with the confirmation class on Rib Mountain. Class will start in mid-September and will be held with Pilgrim. There were no students from St. Stephens. The syllabus has been shared with family & students.
5. On 9/6 the Synod will provide the worship service with the Bishop leading the service. Pastor will take that week for continuing education.
6. Jackie sent an email about starting a new program to reach out to the homebound members that do not have email or TV. They will be able to hear the sermon by calling a specific phone number. Council members should test this out and provide their feedback. We could go on a trial basis. This is an excellent outreach opportunity.
7. On 9/13 there will be God's Work Our Hands. Janci will provide more information during her report.
8. Email from Judy Nickolai indicates there will not be in person Sunday School until the church is fully up and running. We agreed this makes sense. What can we provide to the children for spiritual guidance? Pastor will contact Judy to see if she is willing to put something together.
9. Reviewed the minutes from the 8/12 special meeting. Motion made by Patti to approve; 2nd by Janci. Motion approved.
10. Reviewed the minutes from the 6/25 council meeting. Motion made by Linda to approve; 2nd by Matt. Motion approved.
11. Treasurer report. Matt provided his report. Motion made by Linda to receive and hold for audit; 2nd by Rick. Motion approved.
 1. Compliments to Matt for providing a detailed summary of the Treasurer's report.
12. Financial Secretary Report. Patti provided report.
 1. Motion made by Janci to receive and hold for audit; 2nd by Linda. Motion approved.
13. Vice President's report.
 1. Candidates have been identified for 2 open positions: Kathy Knox for Social Concerns and Sally Scinto-Reinertson for Properties. We also need candidate

for GWCS representative and Council Secretary. Representatives would start after we have a congregational vote.

2. A ballot should be created and emails to as many members that we have emails for. A paper ballot will need to be mailed to those that do not have email, including a return address envelope. Target mailings by mid-September.
 3. We discussed a possible restructure of the council. Instead of having committee chairs for certain committees, we could have special volunteers to handle various projects. We will discuss further at future meetings.
 4. Linda has been in communication with the Bishop about how to help Pastor's family in view of her father's illness. Augusta Victoria Hospital is paying all medical expenses. The Bishop suggested that the church collect the funds and send them to the Bishop who will get them to the hospital. We should send our first funds at the end of September and then monthly from there on.
14. President's Report. Bob sent a response letter to Reuben Roehl regarding opening the church vote. A letter also went out to the congregation.
 15. Education – report provided by Pastor.
 16. Evangelism – God's Work Our Hands will be a virtual project. Members should choose a project from the list or one of their own idea. They should complete the project and respond to what was done and how it went. Pictures are also welcome. Janci will put together a virtual poster on the website with a possible title of Branching Out With Good Works.
 17. Properties – position vacant
 18. Social Concerns – position vacant
 19. Stewardship – meeting was held to discuss the fall campaign. They are thinking of a temple talk video to include with the weekly sermon video. Committee members are to have their assignments completed by mid-September.
 20. Worship – no report

Motion to adjourn by Janci; 2nd by Matt. The meeting was adjourned at 7:57 p.m.
