Lutheran Church in Denver, Colorado.





#### WHEN IMMANUEL WAS AN ETHNIC CONGREGATION

For many decades after its founding in 1883, Immanuel was the center of the Norwegian immigrant community in Wausau. One can imagine how grateful the local Norwegians were to be able to worship in their own language and to communicate socially without having to use the halting English they probably were acquiring in their workplace. Moreover, most had left their homeland knowing that they would not see their parents and other loved ones again. The Immanuel congregation became a close knit community for them, a friendly harbor in a sea of strangers, and a substitute for the family and home they had left. The Norwegians were a small minority in a river town that was still seen as a wilderness settlement populated by Yankees from New England and a majority of German immigrants.

Wausau grew into a city and cracks in the Norwegian ethnic foundation began to appear. Pastor Boe was called by Immanuel in 1903 with the stipulation that he would be conversant in the English language. Obviously, there were young members who were beginning to feel comfortable within the American culture that was no longer so foreign to them. Norwegian was still the lingua franca of the congregation, however. Worship was conducted in Norwegian until the 1920s when Sunday morning services and business matters were conducted in English and worship in Norwegian was scheduled for Sunday afternoons, most likely on a monthly basis. There are no records of Norwegian services after 1932, although there were probably funerals conducted and individual communion given in Norwegian into the 1940s. Perhaps there remained older members who were certain that the preferred language in heaven was Norwegian.

Immanuel's status of being the Norwegian Lutheran Church in Wausau is now in the distant past, but we still keep reminders of some of the Norwegian traditions as evidenced by the rosemaling in the kitchen and the Norwegian table prayer posted on the wall in the Fellowship Hall. Until the pandemic interfered this year, the congregation continued its long history of making lefse in its kitchen. The congregation has had a lot of pastors in its history and, until Pastor Sean Motley, all senior pastors have had a Norwegian heritage. The last pastor to have conversational skill in Norwegian was Pastor Eikeland (1952-60). We still enjoy gathering in Fellowship Hall with a cup of coffee in hand. Our Norwegian forebears would be happy to know that.



#### Immanuel Lutheran Church Council Meeting – Tuesday, November 23, 2020

Meeting via Zoom

Members present: Pastor Niveen Sarras, President Bob Henning, vice-president Linda Hulstrom, Treasurer Matt Munson, financial secretary Patti Busche, stewardship Rick Lohr and worship Judy Kort.

Members absent: Judy Nickolai

1. Devotions were led by Bob based on Psalm 123:3. Ask the Lord to have mercy on us as we are filled with contempt. The state of mind is powerful and can distract away our attention from God.

The meeting was called to order at 6:08 by Bob Henning.

- 2. Pastor's report
  - a. Thanksgiving service with St. Michael Catholic Church has been canceled due to COVID- 19 surge in Wisconsin.
  - b. The Wisconsin River Conference has prepared a virtual Thanksgiving worship service, which I will share with ILC.
  - c. Virtual Mid-week Advent is going to be ready and shared with ILC. The confirmation class takes part in the service.
  - d. A children's booklet on the history of Thanksgiving has been mailed to our Sunday school children.
  - e. Altar guild is going to put a few Christmas decorations in the sanctuary.

- f. Jackie has learned to videotape the sanctuary's worship service, which makes virtual service easier to accomplish.
- g. Zoom Bible study will begin on Sunday 29, 2020, at 10 AM. We will study a book titled Radical Reconciliation.
- h. Jackie and I will put "Good Gifts Tree," and we will prepare a short video introduction about it.
- i. Due to the complaint about receiving the Holy Communion smashed in the mail, Dwala, the altar guilt committee chair, and Sally Johnson, the committee secretary, have suggested stopping mailing the Holy Communion. We can only mail it to those who request it.
- j. I will give a virtual sermon on Sunday, November 29, 2020, at McMinnville Cooperative Ministries in Oregon.
- 3. Worship:
  - a) Three of the 5 committee members feel now is not the time to change the Evangelism duties over to the Worship committee. All members are willing to assist as needed though.
  - b) Discussed Christmas Eve services. Decision was to allow in-person services at 4:00 and 7:00 and pre-registration required. Information will be put in the December Newsletter, in the bulletin and via email. When registering they must provide name, phone number and # of attending. Reservations due on 12/22.
  - c) Cleaning must be performed between services. Individual candles will not be used.
  - d) There will not be a service on Christmas Day. There will be a service on 12/27.

4. Reviewed minutes from the 10/22 meeting. Motion made to approve by Rick; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Matt.
5. Treasurer report. Matt provided his report. Last year we intended to give \$500 from Social Concerns to Neighbors Place but that was not done. This year we will take \$400 from Social Concerns budget and \$100 from another category to be reviewed and identified by Matt. No objections made for Matt to handle. Discussed putting a bowl in the office to collect noisy offering as members have been saving their coins. Motion made by Linda to receive and hold for audit; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Judy Kort. Motion approved.

6. Financial Secretary Report. Patti provided report. Memorial contributions for Barb Peterson have been designated to the choir. Motion made by Linda to receive and hold for audit; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Judy Kort. Motion approved.

- 7. Vice President's report. Linda found a blank ballot to use for the May election. Jane Reilly-Smith has agreed to run for Financial Secretary. Patti will work on training in the spring. There will not be a congregational meeting in January. The final vote on the budget will be in May. The council will be approving the budget at the 12/22/20 meeting to become effective 1/1/2021. The vote in May will be to approve the council's action on the budget. Bob will get a note about this in the December Newsletter.
- 8. President's Report- nothing to report.
- 9. Stewardship –they are meeting next week to tally to pledge cards, work on thank you cards and reminders letters. They will also discuss how to handle Time & Talent. Congratulations from the council to the committee for the well-done job on the video.
- 10. Education nothing to report.
- 11. Properties nothing to report
- 12. Social Concerns nothing to report
- 13. Evangelism nothing to report.
- 14. Other business:
  - a. Pastor & Jackie looked into internet access for the Sanctuary. \$1350 cost would include the hardware with 4 access points, the controller appliance, cables and tech services with 1-year warranty. Council asked of there would be additional fees from Charter. And if possible, a hot spot handle what is needed with a monthly fee. Further investigation is needed.
  - b. Jackie is looking into an in-office postal service. This will save her time from going to the post office. Bob will meet with her to review the details.
  - c. Matt asked to put in an Endowment request for a laptop for the bookkeeper. This way he could do more work from home during this safer at home period. Such a request wouldn't occur until fall as that is when they accept requests. Council discussion included shuffling existing computers to allow him to take an existing laptop home. There were concerns about fee for an extra license for QuickBooks.
  - d. Next meeting will be 12/22 at 6 p.m. The only agenda items will be Christmas Eve service and the 2021 budget.
