Give now for earthquake relief in Haiti: A devastating 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck southwest Haiti on Aug. 14. Over 1,400 people were killed, and that number is expected to increase as search-and-rescue efforts continue. Blocked roads are delaying the delivery of vital supplies to hospitals, which are overwhelmed with more than 6,900 injured people. At least 26,000 homes were damaged or destroyed, but the full extent of damage is still unknown. Haiti is also suffering through a political crisis and was hit by Tropical Storm Grace on Monday night, which caused severe flooding in communities already damaged by the earthquake.

For over two decades, the ELCA has maintained a presence in southern Haiti through support for agricultural and sustainable development work. To continue our engagement with those communities, Lutheran Disaster Response is collaborating with partner organizations in the communities to meet relief needs, including food, water, medical supplies and temporary shelter. In the future, other areas of support will include psychosocial care, water and sanitation, and creating sustainable livelihoods through agriculture and livestock. We also stand with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Haiti as it assesses damage and impacts on churches and church life. Your gifts will support earthquake survivors. Gifts to "Haiti Crisis" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected by the earthquake in Haiti.

The need for FoodShare, medical coverage, and W-2 is clear, however, Afghans are not guaranteed access to these government services. Pastor Niveen has been briefed on ways to help LSS Refugee support the Afghanistan people in need of our expert services right now. Please talk to her if you would like to help.



IMMANUEL HISTORY –



IMMANUEL'S STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

A beautiful and artistic hallmark of Immanuel's sanctuary is its stained glass windows. These windows have usually warranted a glancing look over the years as members occupied the nearby pews. But they really merit a lengthier and studied view, a circumstance not often followed as members vacate the sanctuary at the end of the worship service. When the church building was completed in late 1949, the east and west windows were fitted with plain glass. It was anticipated, however, that stained glass would replace these plain

windows shortly. This was done by 1952 and the project was financed by member donations for each window. For example, the south (and most expensive) window was given in memory of the John Pearson family by Miss Bertha Pearson.

These windows are filled with symbolism. The east and west windows feature the tenets of the Lord's Prayer, with the middle windows on each side respectively featuring the Annunciation and the Baptism of Jesus. The chancel windows, high above the altar, repeat the words of the Communion. The large south window over the main entrance features Christ the King.

I think these stained glass windows are simply beautiful and are a real credit to the members of seventy years ago who deemed it appropriate and necessary to add this art form to our sanctuary. They rival any other church edifice in our community in terms of the use of Christian symbolism and the artistic beauty achieved by the stained glass artist.

A Canaan Olive Oil Update.

In the last year, the value of the dollar has dropped by 15% against the local currency in Palestine. In addition, farm gate prices increased by 15%, the 2020 olive harvest season was exceptionally low compared to previous years, the Canaan products were significantly undervalued in the market in previous years, and actions to correct the issue by adjusting prices were never taken. Of course, the impact of COVID 19 resulted in restrictions to their business and to the farmers also.

As a result of these factors, Canaan has needed to make necessary financial adjustments. The price of the olive oil as increased. We will now buy a bottle at a cost of \$25.00. While the increase is significant, please consider that you are not merely buying olive oil. You are also investing in the welfare of the Palestinian farm families, making their lives less burdensome. You are providing hope.

<u>President's report</u>- Bob assisted with properties help. The motors installed on the boiler were not proper motors. Lights in one of the woman's bathroom were fixed by replacing a switch. The DunRite representative recommended we work with a contractor that specializes in flat roofs such as Traska or Stuart's Contracting Services.

Sally would also like the fan motors in the old boiler room inspected as they keep tripping the circuit breaker which shuts the system down. Sally made motion to use \$4800 from Payroll Protection Plan (PPP) which is in the General fund as well as \$300 from the building budget to cover the circulating pumps. 2nd by Judy K. Approved without objections. Also discussed getting an estimate on the roof from Stuart's. Sally made a motion to contact Stuart's for estimate. 2nd by Patti. Approved without objections.

Stewardship: no report

Social concerns: nothing to report.

<u>Worship:</u> a request has been made by a member of the congregation to bring back coffee hour on a small-scale basis in the gathering room. Council approved for the member to proceed.

New Business:

- Semi Annual Meeting suggested the meeting be run virtually but to email and mail out ballots. Would like this in place by the end of June. It was suggested that we first sent out communication on what we would like to accomplish and how this will work. The target to have the new council in place is August 1. The congregation also needs to approve the action of the council on the 2021 budget. There would not be any committee reports included.
- Malbrit work contact them to get this work scheduled before the next meeting. That way we can approve any additional funds needed for the fan motors work.
- Would like to have an estimate from Stuart's on the roof before the next meeting so we can vote on it.
- Synod offering Pastor emailed request that we contribute to the Synod Assembly. Council approved \$200 donation to be taken from General fund (Pastor Hoven).
