Therefore, I need to travel during May.

I will make sure that your spiritual needs are met. I will coordinate with other pastors in the area to cover for me in an emergency. I will also rely on our lay ministers to lead the worship services.

I do not have the right words to express how grateful I am to you. May the Lord bless you. Amen!

Proposed BYLAW change: This removes the term limits due to the lack of volunteers to serve on Council. The information to be removed has the strike through. This will be voted on at the semi-annual meeting.

C10.05 The members of the Congregational Council shall be elected by written ballot at the annual meeting to service for two (2) years or until their successors are elected. Such members shall be eligible to serve no more than two (2) full terms consecutively. A member appointed to fill a vacancy of one (1) year or less shall be eligible to two (2) consecutive terms. Their terms shall begin at the close of the annual meeting at which they are elected.



IMMANUEL HISTORY –

IMMANUEL MEMBERS WHO HAVE ENTERED THE MINISTRY

Congregations take pride in having members who have answered the call to enter the ministry, and Immanuel has had quite a few in its 139 year history. Brothers Einar and Elmer Larson entered the Lutheran ministry about 100 years ago. Cecil Tellekson and Harry Baker were local teachers who became very active in the Immanuel congregation, and, influenced by Pastor Quello, entered the seminary during World War II. Immanuel supported both of them through a Student Assistance Fund, the first congregation in the Norwegian Lutheran Church in America (NLCA) to establish such a support vehicle. The practice of supporting seminary students from the congregation has continued to the present. Jack Olson was ordained in 1950, only months after the current building at 630 Adams was completed. Sally Nelson, a part time student and clerical worker, joined Immanuel through adult baptism and entered the seminary upon graduation from UWSP. She was ordained at Immanuel in 1991. Soon, Maggie Westaby, baptized, confirmed, and married at Immanuel, will enter the Lutheran ministry. Again, the Immanuel congregation takes pride in Maggie's accomplishment as she becomes the seventh member in its history to enter the ministry. The three years of theological education plus a year of internship are challenging ones but a necessary pathway to a well-educated clergy.

Olive Oil is Here! Canaan Fair Trade olive oil is available in the church office. The 500 ml bottles are available in the church office for \$25.00. The purchase of this excellent olive oil supports the Palestinian farmers who are part of the cooperative. In addition to using it for your own purposes, it also makes a wonderful gift to give someone!

A Canaan Olive Oil Update

In the last year, the value of the dollar has dropped by 15% against the local currency in Palestine. In addition, farm gate prices increased by 15%, the 2020 olive harvest season was exceptionally low compared to previous years, the Canaan products were significantly undervalued in the market in previous years, and actions to correct the issue by adjusting prices were never taken. Of course, the impact of COVID 19 resulted in restrictions to their business and to the farmers also.

As a result of these factors, Canaan has needed to make necessary financial adjustments. The price of the olive oil as increased. We will now buy a bottle at a cost of \$25.00. While the increase is significant, please consider that you are not merely buying olive oil. You are also investing in the welfare of the Palestinian farm families, making their lives less burdensome. You are providing hope.

Our olive oil ministry will continue, God's Work, Our Hands.

Bill Messinger was born and raised in Milwaukee in a second generation family business environment. He received his BA from Yale and his JD from the University of Minnesota. He is a Hazelden-trained addiction professional. After completing treatment at Hazelden in 1995, Bill became concerned about the problem of relapse prevention and how to improve recovery rates from substance use disorders. In 1998, Bill learned of the high success rates from addiction for physicians and pilots. Since that time, he has been an advocate for using the same approach for other groups, with a focus on helping families come up with solutions for addressing addiction in loved ones.

Addiction & Relapse: A New Paradigm for Recovery

The Center of Addiction & Faith is presenting a one-hour free webinar on April 28, 2022, 11:00am -12 Noon Central Time with a followup 30-minute Zoom discussion.

With fentanyl showing up in every kind of street drug, relapse following treatment is

becoming increasingly dangerous. Relapse is widely accepted as the norm following treatment, but does it need to be? There are evidence-based practices that work very well to prevent relapse, but those practices are not regularly applied in the field.

Bill Messinger, retired attorney and recovery coach, will help us understand the state of current relapse prevention practices and what we can do to improve outcomes. He will help us understand how faith communities could play an important supportive role helping people on their journey back to wholeness. Join us for this free webinar and discussion on this life and death issue. The webinar is for everyone, clergy and lay.





Rev. Dr. Ann Fritschel Wartburg Theological Seminary, Dubuque Lay School Faculty Member Retires upon the conclusion of the 2021-20

Retires upon the conclusion of the 2021-2022 Academic Year We rejoice with Rev. Dr. Ann Fritschel of the ECSW who retires from Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque IA after 26 years of faithful teaching. Dr. Ann has served at Wartburg Seminary as Professor of Hebrew Bible since 1997, as Director of the Center for

Theology and Land since 2010, and as holder of the Rev. Dr. Frank L. & Joyce S. Benz Chair in Scripture since 2014. As Dr. Fritschel concludes this chapter, she

anticipates enjoying a new chapter of life that includes part-time parish ministry and tutoring in the public school system, among other things. From the beginning of her time as a member of the Wartburg faculty, she has also been a pillar of the lay school in our synod since its beginnings. A retirement celebration with evening prayer is planned for May 5th. Bishop Anne, Lay school director, Pr. Jen Hoffman, and Pr. Jenn Pockat are looking forward to celebrating with her and the Wartburg community in person. Dr. Ann's legacy runs deep in this synod as countless rostered and lay leaders have learned from her wisdom and knowledge of the scriptures over the years.



CRITICAL HOUSING INCREASES IN BUDGET: Since the original overdue deadline of the budget passed last October, hundreds of Lutherans contacted their members to end the inaction and include increases in critical needs such as housing aid and homeless assistance. In the final version, advocates succeeded in obtaining increases in <u>several low-income spending accounts</u>, including a boost of more than \$4 billion in housing assistance.

This comes at a critical time as inflation costs and the shortage of available housing are meeting historic highs. In the coming days and weeks, as congressional committees prepare a bill for the current fiscal cycle, ELCA advocacy will be amplifying opportunities to take action on core priorities and principles in the federal budget.
