Thanks to all who responded and provided input at this time. The council's merger team has met with St John's and St Andrew's merger teams so far. The council's team will meet with First English's team in the next couple weeks. Our next council meeting is scheduled for June 16, 2025, at which time we will set the date for the Special Congregational Meeting to vote on the merger, knowing that it takes 3 weeks to make this meeting official. Therefore, we are looking at sometime in early July.

A big thank you to all of you for hanging in there during this process. I know this has all been very hard and tiring, but we know that God has been with us all the way. He has a plan and His love for us will comfort us as He takes our hand and leads us forward.

The meeting was called to order at 6:07 p.m.

Homme Home Request: State won't allow new residents until requirements met for additional smoke detectors in currently unoccupied spaces. They are losing money due to the empty beds. S150,000 was already spent to update smoke detectors but additional work is needed. They have implemented 24 hour/day fire watch. They need help with daily expenses and fire detection work. They are licensed for 75 residents and had 57 residents. They have since lost more and cannot fill the rooms due to the hold by the state. They draw residents from a large area with many from Wittenberg and Antigo. Any questions contact Delores at djkessel1@gmail.com.

Devotions were led by Patti Busche – D.I.S.C.I.P.L.E

Secretary Report: notes from 3/23/25 meetings. No changes. Rick made motion to accept the meeting notes; 2nd by Matt. Motion passed.

Treasurer Report: February reports were passed out. Confirmed that monies in Special Funds can be disbursed with approval from Church Council. Rick made motion to approve Treasurer reports and hold for audit; 2nd by Patti Busche. Motion passed.

Financial Secretary: Report was handed out. No questions. Motion to accept and hold for audit was made by Rick and seconded by Matt. Motion passed.

President's Report:

- Ruder Ware has been hired as attorney. Will create bill of sale for building/property if sale to River City is approved.
- April 26 ELCA Bishop and Pastor Dara will be in town and will meet with each church. We are excused from meeting due to current status.
- Synod assembly is June 7. Bob Henning is willing to attend. Rick made motion to cover expenses for Bob H. to attend synod assembly. Patti Busche 2nd. Motion passed.

Worship Committee: the Easter service was very nice.

Unfinished Business:

- 1. Sale of building and property River City Church: Resolution for congregational meeting was reviewed. No changes. Motion to approve resolution for congregation vote made by Rick and 2nd by Kathy. Motion passed. The vote will be a ballot vote.
- 2. Merger with other churches: Dara should have met with First English. Waiting for St. Andrew's to provide time to meet. Will meet with First English after their new minister is here. Plan is to focus hard on this after May 18 which is the last date for our church visits.

New Business:

- 1. Disposition of personal property (items donated or purchased by members):
 Discussion on who to approve removal of items was had as some items were removed and Altar Guild was not made aware but had planned to use for Easter. Also, because concerns were expressed that outside party was interested in items. All requests must go through church office. Priority was set as:
 - a. Immanuel members
 - b. Church we merge with
 - c. ELCA churches deadline date will be determined
 - d. River City Church

Historical items – Local historical society, some seminaries accept these items also.

- 2. Kathy Robinson appreciation: Discussed providing a grant to Kathy for her educational fees. Monies could come from Pastoral Sabbatical, Education and Adult Studies funds. The money would be sent directly to Wartburg College. Kathy Knox made a motion that we give a grant of \$10,000 to Kathy/Wartburg out of the funds mentioned. Patti Busche 2nd. Motion passed.
- 3. Homme Home request: Discussed that this could be a legacy grant. Homme Home was supported greatly by ILC in the past both with money and resident birthday parties. Bob H. had suggested we make donation of \$150,00. Rick made a motion to bring the request before the congregation. The resolution should indicate the need and that this could be part of ILC legacy. Matt 2nd. Motion passed.
